SERVICE LEARNING BP 381

Public Law 30-53 stipulates that beginning with 9th graders in school year 2011-2012, each student will be required to fulfill <u>75 hours</u> of service learning to graduate in high school.

Attendance: Absences and tardies will either be marked excused or unexcused. Approved parental notes and proper admit slips are required for an excused absence. Student are given admit slips for each day that they are absent. Students are allowed six-day parent notes per semester. Absences more than two consecutive days are required to have a doctor's note and must be approved by the school health counselor. Students who have 6 or more unexcused absences will receive "NC= No Credit" for the semester regardless if they are receiving a passing grade for the semester. Students who come in tardy three (3) times will receive one (1) unexcused absence.

SERVICE LEARNING PLAN/PROJECT:

1st Semester: Active participation of school and community activities accrue service learning hours.

2nd Semester: Active participation of school and community activities accrue service learning hours.

Note: Students can earn service learning hours by using stages of service learning.

 - Become ready to provide meaningful service.
- 2. Action (2hours)
 - Perform direct and indirect service
 - Your actions have value, purpose and meaning
 - Your actions offer unique leaning
- 3. Reflection (1 hour)
 - Describe what happened
 - Examine the difference it made
 - Discuss thoughts and feelings
- 4. Demonstration (1 hour)
 - Report to peers (make a group presentation)

Makeup Policy:

Makeup Work: Students with unexcused absences will not be allowed to make up the work missed. Students with excused absences are entitled to one class day for each day of absence. It is the student's responsibility to ask about makeup work. Students who return to class the day of a test will need to take the test, if they were in class at the time the test was announced. Because responsibility is an important life skill, unless there are extenuating circumstances, late work is not accepted. Exceptions will be at the teacher discretion.
